The History of the SIG



Our special interest group started in March 2015 as a result of a display at Telford, in the previous November, by the car and motorcycle sig. We had the theme of "cars from the movies" and it got me thinking. My initial idea was for the group to concentrate on James Bond cars and aircraft and so, with the support of 5 fellow Wirral IPMS members, i submitted a request and the 007 sig was born. And it didn't really take off. I did a bit of promotion but apart from a dozen or so friends and club supporters, it wasn't going anywhere.

And then, on one of my days off in January 2016, daydreaming with a cup of tea, i had an idea. Change the name. !

I messaged my good friend Richard Middleton straight away, a supporter of this group and my go-to IPMS advice guru, to see if i could do this. Apparently i could and within the hour we became the "Movie sig". A few hours later and the name changed again to the "Movie & TV sig" after a member, who i can't remember but am grateful to, suggested the addition of television, a clever stroke that stright away expanded our remit expotentially. By 4 o clock that Friday we had 35 members!

By this point i was starting to get to know Ian Costall who had recently joined our IPMS branch. We both had the same interests in common and i asked him if he would help out with the sig, to which he not only accepted but helped me run the Telford displays. In 2017 another club member, Dave Howard, came on board in much the same way. Both Iain and Dave are stunning builders and they took our displays to an incredible level. And if it wasn't for Dave, the sig would have folded.

So as the membership and interest grew so did our confidence to display at Telford 2016. Iain made a fantastic art deco cinema frontage for the table and with Colin Bebington's scratchbuilt Thunderbird 3 to the fore the table got a fantastic reception from the public. We were someting very different.





We displayed at Telford in 2017 and 2018 too, by which time the sig was getting a bit stale. We weren't recruiting any new members and i personally was struggling to run the group. Months and months went by without any interaction. By autumn 2019, I was also getting bored with my local branch. I had stepped down from the Committee and just wanted to go to model shows as a visitor. Iain was feeling the same and so, despite booking in for Telford we both decided to pull the plug and cancel the display. It was the end of the sig as far as i was concerned. Then up to the plate stood my friend and fellow club member Dave Howard who felt he couldn't run the sig but didn't want to see it fold. Single handedly he took over that years Telford display and with the support of fellow sig members put on one of the best displays. Thanks to their unselfish support they gave me the breathing space i needed and saved our group.

And then came covid !!!!!!!!

Which has helped us re-think and re-launch the group. Both myself and other members are no longer part of IPMS Wirral, which was nessecary for the sig to stand independently. Part of our failing was that we were always seen as an extension of that club, which despite appearances, was never the case.

Personally i was really looking forward to Telford last November but sadly a reaction to the covid booster stopped me going. But by feeling i "missed out" and i really feel like i did, it has energised me into moving forward. Martin Aris has always been a strong member of this group and has been getting more involved. I even asked him if he wanted to take over the group at one point !! Anyway, it is great that he has now offered his services as SIG Secretary and with myself, lain and Dave we hope to really start taking the group forward. And with you, start writing the next pages of the story.
